

## Worksheet 1.1. The Use of Similes in *Things Fall Apart*

Simile	Meaning
Okonkwo's fame had grown like a bush-fire in the harmattan.	Implies speed and impossibility of stopping it. The harmattan is a dry and dusty trade wind that often turns untended embers into fires.
[Fending for his father's house] was like pouring grains of corn into a bag full of holes.	Taking care of his father's house is a waste of time and resources.
The earth burned like hot coals and roasted all the yams that had been sown.	The heat and dryness ruined the new crops. Ironic, since yams are meant to be roasted when they are fully grown and ready for harvest.
The drummers took up their sticks and the air shivered and grew tense like a tightened bow.	The bow suggests readiness for military action as well as tension.
[Ikemefuna] grew rapidly like a yam tendril in the rainy season.	As a teenage boy, Ikemefuna grew rapidly, so that it seems he shot up almost overnight. Also implies vulnerability, since a tendril is fragile.
something seemed to give way inside [Nwoye], like the snapping of a tightened bow.	Okonkwo's son guesses that Ikemefuna has been killed and is devastated; he viewed him as an older brother.
[Okonkwo] drank palm-wine from morning till night, and his eyes were red and fierce like the eyes of a rat when it was caught by the tail and dashed against the floor.	Okonkwo is drinking to forget his role in Ikemefuna's death. The rat suggests his wrong behavior and the fact that he may have to pay for it.
[Okonkwo] felt like a drunken giant walking with the limbs of a mosquito.	He was a huge and strong man, but he was weak after two days without food or sleep, drinking palm wine.
Ezinma bubbled with energy like fresh palm- wine.	Suggests her lively disposition at times. Palm- wine is prized by the Igbo, as was Ezinma by her family.
"Agbala do-o-o-o! Agbala ekeneo-o-o-o," came the voice like a sharp knife cutting through the night.	The sharp knife suggests the fear that people would experience in the night. Also suggests pain, death.
